

Computer Labs Open for Tax Preparation

Beginning today, Greensboro Housing Authority (GHA) computer labs will be open for residents to file their state and federal income taxes online. The Facilitated Self-Assistance (FSA), a free online filing service through Myfreetaxes.com, is for people who:

- Have a household Adjusted Gross Income of \$57,000 or less.
- Have basic computer and internet skills.
- Want to do their own taxes with access to an IRS certified volunteer.



FSA has one of two ways to get free help from IRS certified volunteers. FSA volunteers will be available by phone, email or online chat to answer questions. If in-person help is needed, call 2-1-1 for local Volunteer Income Tax Assistance sites. All FSA tax preparation sites will begin service on Monday, February 4th.

People wanting to use the FSA service should be prepared with the following:

- Driver’s license or non-driver ID. Spouses filing jointly must both be present.
- W-2s, 1099s and other income and tax related forms.
- Social Security or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) for each family member and working adult.
- Childcare provider name, address and tax ID.
- Bank routing and account numbers for checking and savings accounts if direct deposit is desired.
- Valid email address.
- A copy of last year’s tax return if available.

GHA computer labs will be open for residents as follows:
